From the desk of Mother Marie Julie, Superior General


y dear good Friends,

Thank vou! n March 21, Lauren Hanrahan attended the funeral of Sister Bernadette, her beloved First Grade teacher. She says it was important for her to be there, to pray for Sister and to give thanks to God for the blessing that she was to her and to so many others.

In her 70 years as a Sister of Charity, Sister Bernadette nurtured the hearts and minds of thousands of little ones like Lauren, in her ministry as teacher in schools in Connecticut and Minnesota.

Lauren shares: "Sister Bernadette was my First Grade teacher, and in many ways, also one of my first exposures to the Catholic Faith, seeing as my family was in the process of converting from Protestantism to Catholicism.

One memory I have of her was at Christmas time, when she set up the Nativity Scene. We all gathered around the table, then she took out each piece, described them and explained their significance in the story of the birth of Our Lord.

I am thankful I had Sister Bernadette as my First Grade teacher. I will never forget her happy smile, which she so generously bestowed on each student."

Lauren credits Sister Bernadette with helping to plant in her young, tender soul the seeds of a strong Catholic Faith which now shapes her life, and which she is passing on to her children.

Sister Bernadette kept the list of each of her classes for the 70 years that she taught. And she prayed for each class right up until her death.

hen the residents of St. Joseph Home for the Aged moved into their new facility 35 years ago, we wondered what we would do with the old building that was now empty.

It wasn't long before one of the Sisters came across a family who was living in unsuitable conditions, and so she offered them

temporary housing in the old St. Joseph building. That was the beginning of Holy Family Home & Shelter. Since then, hundreds of families have found shelter and given a new start in life at Holy Family Home & Shelter.

Over the years, the Shelter has seen much needed renovation and upgrade. But there is still so much more to be done. One need that has been weighing on us for quite a while is the need to convert the sleeping quarters from dormitories with curtained cubicles, to private rooms. Simple rooms; small but adequate. A dignified, private space for each family. The people who come to us have lost so much, we want to be sure they do not lose their dignity.

On Giving Tuesday 2022, we reached out to you, asking your help with this project. Your response was amazing! Because of your goodness, we were able to renovate 12 rooms. We were also able to put a new look on the general gathering space with a fresh coat of paint and replace the old, worn-out carpet. There is much more to be done, but you have given us a very good start and we are eternally grateful!

Giving Tuesday was begun to provide an opportunity for those with more, to

In January 2022, Mrs. Maureen Fleming, herself a graduate of the Academy of the Holy Family (AHF), came on board at the school as Campus Minister. This position was a first for AHF. She immediately began a Peer Ministry Club. Its mission is to foster a community of faith where together the students grow in their knowledge of God's love and mercy, in their recognition of the Holy Spirit's movement within and around them, and in their call to live as disciples of Jesus Christ.

The students immediately jumped into action with their first student-led

JAM event. (Jesus And Marists). Marists in honor of Mary. For the students of this all-girls school, Mother Mary has always been their model of true womanhood.

"Identity In Christ" was the theme of the JAM event. It was a time of fun, community building, and growing in faith. The students ministered to their peers by teachings and witness talks. There was time for personal reflection and small group sharing, facilitated by the students. At the conclusion of the event, the participants were invited to share their experience of the day. Akinyi: "Peer Ministry gives us the opportunity to experience the joy of a faith-filled community."

Last Fall, in preparation for Christmas, the group hosted a second JAM event: "Make Our Hearts His Bethlehem. Prepare Him Room". It was well attended and well received.

The Peer Ministers organize praise and worship Holy Hours with Eucharistic adoration. The joy on the faces of the students as they sing their favorite praise & worship songs, and their reverence as they sit in prayer before Our Eucharistic Lord, is inspiring. "Being a part of this Peer Ministry brings ME closer to God." - Chanelle, Peer Minister.

Mrs. Fleming says she is blessed to be mentor to such an amazing group of girls. The group, which began with 12 peer min-

isters, has now grown to 18. They are prayerfully discerning and planning a wide range of faith-filled events.

ight and day. That's how my Mom saw the difference between her and my Dad. My parents had vastly different approaches to many things.

My Dad, who passed away in 2015, was extremely detailed. He had all his documents in order. He had even written his obituary! Everything was planned out and written down in a notebook, bullet-point style. His hand-written list was backed up on his computer! All we had to do was follow his instructions when he passed away.

BUT, my Dad never discussed with us his final wishes or plans and I admit, we were surprised by a few of them. I had questions. It gave me peace of mind knowing that I was doing exactly as he wished, but I do regret that we never spoke about his plans while he was alive. Some in my family had difficulty reconciling with his decisions. A conversation or two about his wishes and his estate plan would have helped.

My Mom, who passed away in 2020, was the total opposite.

Mom never thought she had much of value and didn't see the need for a will or a plan. She would say that my brother, sister and I were welcome to fight over her six espresso makers! We did find a Guardianship document among her possessions, but it was so old that it was no longer relevant. She had it drawn up when my sister was young and it basically only covered guardianship of my sister if my Mom passed away while she was still a minor.

HOWEVER, my Mom always talked to us about her final wishes. Even though it was never a comfortable conversation, we knew exactly what to do when she passed away.

Two parents. Two different approaches to estate planning. Night and Day. Fortunately, we were able to settle both estates with ease. My Dad's, because despite not exactly agreeing with his wishes, we followed the written plan laid out for us. My Mom's, because despite not having a written plan, she often talked about her final wishes and what she wanted us to do.

What is your approach to estate planning? My advice to you? Be like my parents. BOTH of them. Have a well-thought out written estate plan AND let your family and friends know your wishes. If you already have an estate plan there is no time like the present to review it. Tax laws change, and so do family circumstances – births, deaths, divorces, moves to another state, etc. Take the time to make sure that your estate plan still works for you.

And when you write or re-write your will, please consider including a bequest to the Sisters of Charity. A gift through your estate plan is an ideal way to support us. You'll be building our future financial strength and helping to ensure that our mission and ministries continue to help our brothers and sisters in need.
