“Familiarity reduces the greatness of things.” This saying comes to mind when I think of the many signs and symbols of our Catholic faith that surround us and, perhaps, that we take for granted because they are so familiar to us. One of these symbols is the Crucifix. It hangs in our churches and, perhaps in our homes. But do we really see the greatness of this symbol?

Pope Francis recently reminded us that the Crucifix is not just a symbol or a wall decoration; it is the entire expression of the love of God who sent His Son to die for us. “How many Christians,” he asked, “spend time looking at the Crucifix? Look at the Crucifix in silence, look at the wounds, look at the heart of Jesus Christ crucified, the Son of God, annihilated, humiliated for love. Christ’s death on the cross shows the ‘madness’ of God’s love for His children. Whenever we look at the Crucifix, we find this love.”

Sister Loreto found this love. She shares that, from childhood, she learned to love the Crucifix. “When things were tough, I would hold the Crucifix and gaze into Jesus’ eyes. He strengthened me and filled me with His love.”

Friend, when you look at the Crucifix, we pray that you too will know ‘the madness’ of God’s love, God’s unconditional, infinite, amazing, incredible love for you. The Saints tell us that it wasn’t the nails that held Jesus on the cross. It was His love for each of us. His love for YOU, His love for me.


